Up to 20 participants can take part in the workshop and there may be opportunities for more to be involved to help with creating artwork, joining in with communal songs etc.

**Entry Fee** is only £16.50 for adults and £7.50 for children of 12 years and under.

HQ opens at 7am for the walkers to start at 7:30am. The last departure for those walking the full 25 miles is 9am, but those walking a shorter route may leave up until 10:30am.

## Cambridge Half Marathon

Some ten thousand runners took to the streets on Sunday 6 March to take part in the 2022 TTP Cambridge half marathon, including 7 representing Papworth Trust. Whilst it was undoubtedly a chilly start for the them, the weather was kind and remained dry on the scenic 13.1 circuit around the historic city.

The same 13.1-mile course was used as the delayed 2021 race, starting and ending in Victoria Avenue, beside the Midsummer Common event headquarters, and taking insights including King's College, Grantchester and Jesus College.

We were absolutely delighted that our runners raised an incredible £2,500, which will support our work across the East of England.
