Thank you, Tom for the fantastic meal and hosting us so graciously.





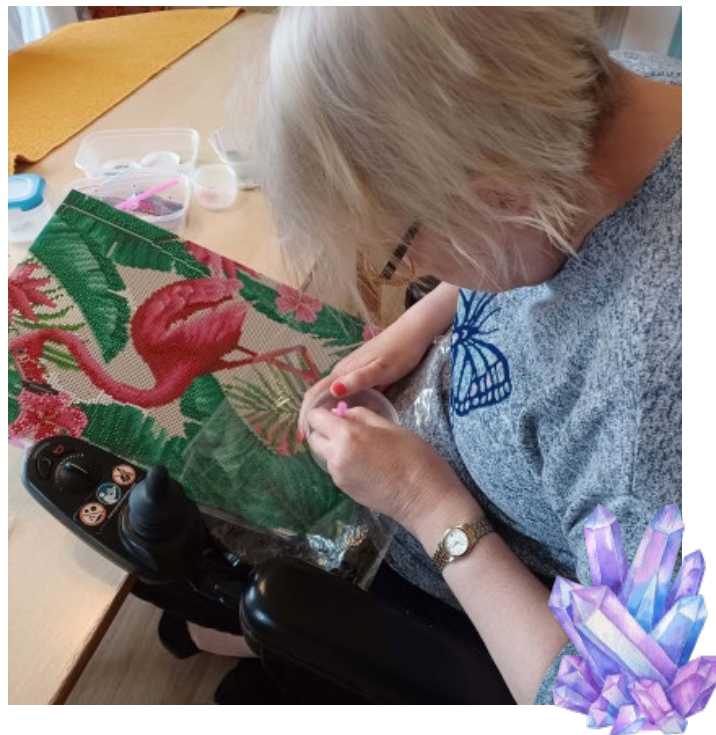
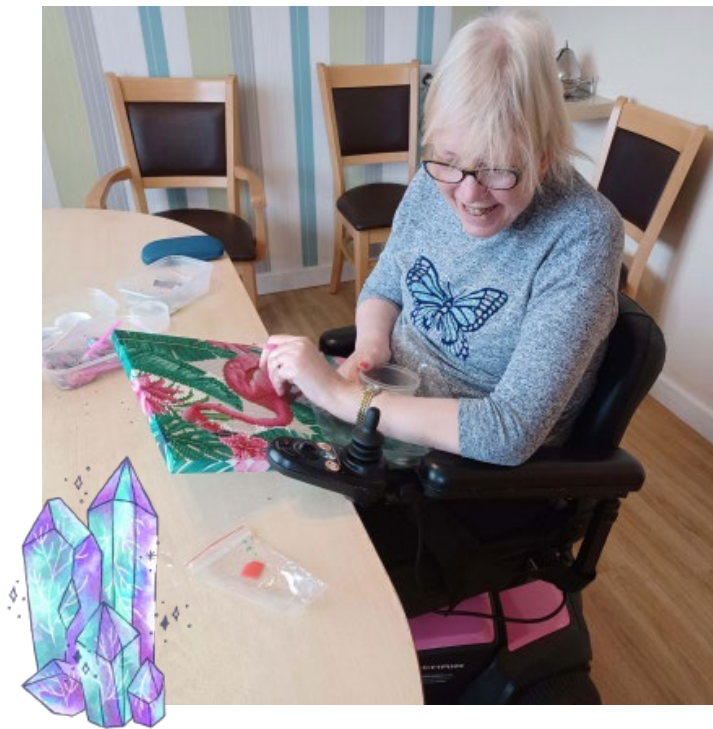
Ladies night
